




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## WHAT IS THE STATE OF HEALTH IN THE EU?

- Close collaboration with renowned **experts**













## Tackling the decline in vaccination confidence across the EU

- Vaccination prevents an estimated 2.5 million deaths each year
- Vaccine coverage across the EU is waning
- The WHO named vaccine disinformation as a top public health threat for 2019

**Vaccine hesitancy** is a major public health threat all across Europe, which can be tackled by improving health literacy, countering disinformation and actively involving health workers.





## 2> Harnessing the digital transformation of health promotion and disease prevention

- Apps, wearable technology and online fora can all empower people to enjoy a healthy lifestyle and prevent them from developing an illness
- To serve prevention/promotion/public health policy objectives
- Need to be aware of risks of the digital divide; misinformation and data protection








## Strengthening the evidence base on access to health care


- European Pillar of Social Rights: Everyone has the right to timely access to affordable, preventive and curative health care of good quality
- Yet gaps in health care accessibility are still very much a reality in the EU / risks of complacency about health system accessibility
- Lack of relevant data/indicators to truly capture access hurdles

## Innovation and experimentation to support the organization of care : stronger primary care ; integration of care, etc

- New "professions", enhanced roles for undervalued ones, teamwork, coordination and integration reveal the scope for new areas of work and a more flexible distribution of roles among health workers
- Task shifting ultimately aims at health system resilience, ensuring that a certain skill mix can flexibly adapt to foreseen and unforeseen challenges in the future

## The product life cycle of medicines reveals ample scope for Member State cooperation

- A broader view on pharmaceutical policies is required to better understand the factors that affect patients' timely access to affordable and cost-effective medicines
- Greater cooperation among EU countries could improve the affordability of medicines through more transparent pricing and greater competition among manufacturers







## **Develop cooperation across the product life cycle of medicines** to address factors that affect accessibility availability costeffectiveness and affordability

- A global approach rather than successive independent steps
- Address shortages
- Cooperation on Health Technology Assessment
- Address factors impacting affordability and sustainability of health systems
- Sharing experiences and pooling expertise on pricing and procurement methods
- Exploiting the potential savings to be reaped from generics and biosimilars
